### Year 2

Year 2 have enjoyed a historical week continuing in their learning about the history of London. This week the focus has been on *The Gunpowder Plot* and the boys have been enraptured to learn of the twists and turns in the tale and the gory end that the plotters met!

In Maths lessons, the Year 2 boys have impressed me with their work on adding and subtracting multiples of ten. Their hard work over the previous terms is shining through in their calculation work and many have been excited to begin applying their knowledge to column addition and subtraction.

## Year 1

Year 1 have been very busy aliens this week! Mrs Ross and Mr Gale have both enjoyed teaching the class. Their alien head dresses were designed and created on Monday. The boys then participated in imaginative role-play with their alien friends to consider such questions as "How does an alien clean his teeth?" and "What would you do if you met a human being?". Alien diaries have been carefully written and then read aloud with infectious enthusiasm and confidence.

Dr Essex has also enjoyed working with one of our Read, Write Inc groups this week.

# **EYFS**

Read, Write, Inc. was the main focus for our curricular learning during the last few days of this half term: from flag making and shape sorting to hunting and robot building. The boys worked hard taking their interests further and developing their communicative skills through sharing their creations. They also learnt to ask for help when needed and to answer questions, too. Thank you to Mr Price who returned to Zoom to read us a wonderful story, *The Little House by the Sea.* The boys listened intently and enjoyed finding the many creatures that featured in this delightful story.









This week, the boys in Reception are refreshed and eager to learn again. We have started with Festivals of Light, the first being Diwali. We have made some great Rangoli patterns using the Numicon tiles, a wonderful example of cross curricular work with the boys talking numbers while making and creating patterns.

Ahead of tonight's fireworks display, the boys had great fun splatter-painting their own firework displays.
