Forest School

Following on from our last Forest School lesson, we focused on butterflies this week. The boys looked at the features of a butterfly as well as their beautiful patterns. Working in pairs the boys collected a wonderful range of natural items and set about creating a new species of butterflies.

Year 1 focused on flowers this week. The boys played a game that helped them understand how a flower is pollinated as well as the life cycle of a flower. Everyone was keen to have a go at being the bee! Following on from this the boys carefully dissected a flower and as a class learned the names of the various parts of the flower.

Using sorting hoops, Year 2 explored how to sort and classify natural items by focusing on similarities and differences. The boys were encouraged to collect as many natural items as they could and were then encouraged to sort them using the given criteria. They were then asked to come up with their own way to sort the objects and the class tried to guess what the criteria was.
